Rail Worker Strike – Wednesday 5th October:

Rail strikes have been planned for Saturday 1st October, Wednesday 5th October and Saturday 8th October. As one of the planned strikes will have an impact on a school day, students and their families should look for alternative travel arrangements on Wednesday 5th October. The Department for Education (DfE) has not instructed schools and academies to close nor revert to online learning. As a result, students should make every effort to attend the academy on Wednesday 5th October. That said, we do appreciate that a number of BOA students rely on rail transport for longer journeys. Families should decide whether it is safe or appropriate to travel on Wednesday 5th October. We will set work on Microsoft Teams for students who are not able to make it into the academy for genuine reasons.

West Midlands Metro Strike:

Please be aware that tram drivers and workers on this service have announced their plans to strike for up to 52 days in the run-up to the Christmas period and just after. Students who use this service must look for alternative travel arrangements. Attendance:

The Department for Education (DfE) revised its guidance on attendance and absence monitoring in May 2022. Please be advised that an attendance record below 95% for an academic year is classed as 'unacceptable absence' and an attendance record below 90% is classed as 'persistent absence'. For an attendance record to fall below 95% for the academic year, a student will have been away from school for 10 days in total or more. Please assist the academy by ensuring your child attends regularly. On a related matter, the Department for Education (DfE) has announced that schools and students should anticipate a 'return to normality' for the examination series next summer. Post-16 Bursary:


Thank you to all families who have submitted applications and supporting documents for the Post-16 bursary. We will begin to process these next week and aim to make the first payments ahead of the October half term break.
