# Re: Principal's newsletter – 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022

I hope this email finds you all well and I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a restful half term break. Ahead of the end of this half term, I am writing to you all with some important updates.

## **Summer Projects:**

Thank you to all students in Year 10 and Year 12 who submitted summer projects. Whereas these were the focus of the first few lessons for each new year group, teachers from each pathway area nominated some of the best work for special mention. I have written to the students and parents to thank them for the fantastic work that was submitted. These letters should be with you via Royal Mail during the course of next week.

## Year 11 Mock Examinations:

Students in Year 11 have received an overview of the Year 11 mock examinations that are scheduled to take place at the end of next month, during w/c 21<sup>st</sup> November and w/c 28<sup>th</sup> November 2022. Mr Mitchell will also write to parents and carers of Year 11 ahead of the half term break with details of the mock examinations. Revision exercises can be found on Microsoft Teams, which will assist students in the lead-up to the examinations. I would like to take this opportunity to wish all students the very best during their assessments.

### **Enrichment and Extracurricular Activities:**

Our programme of enrichment and extracurricular activities will begin just after the half term break. These activities typically take place on Friday afternoons, from 1.30pm to 2.30pm. We will provide students with termly overviews of the activities on offer. In addition, enrichment sessions also take place at this time, when students are able to access support from their subject teachers. Access to these sessions will be through arrangement.

### Shows and showcases:

Shows and showcases will start in earnest from next half term onwards, starting with BOA's Christmas Show – *Beauty and the Beast* – at the Old Rep Theatre. There also showcases from the Music and Creative Media pathways. ### **Rail Worker Strikes:**

There are further rail worker strikes planned to take place on the following days: Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup>, Saturday 5<sup>th</sup>, Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November. The Department for Education (DfE) has not instructed schools and academies to close nor revert to online learning. As a result, students should make every effort to attend the academy on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November and Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November. Please ensure you check the services your child uses and, if these have been affected, look for alternative travel arrangements. That said, we do appreciate that a number of BOA students rely on rail transport for much longer journeys. Families should decide whether it is safe or appropriate to travel. We will set work on Microsoft Teams for students who are not able to make it into the academy for genuine reasons.

## **GCSE Retakes:**

Students in Year 12 and Year 13 who are retaking GCSEs in English Language and/or Mathematics will receive a personalised timetable via email ahead of the half term break. The timetable will inform students of the time, date and location of their GCSE examination(s). The retakes in English Language and Mathematics are scheduled to take place on the following dates:
